

# EVERYDAY MATERIAL HANDLING HAND PLACEMENT



KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE



#### STRAPPING LOADS

When using tie downs make sure to keep your fingers out of the pinch zone behind the latch.

Keep hand on live end and tighten as needed.

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE



#### FOLDING LADDERS

Keep hands away from the pinch point when folding up for storage or to move.

HAND 39 SAFETY

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE



#### PIPE

Recognize the pinch point and keep hands away. May not be a heavy flange but when or if you drop the pipe, it will pinch your fingers.

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE



#### HEAVY MATERIAL

When grabbing an awkward piece of a material keep your hands out from the line of fire.

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE

#### CRUSH POINT

End of formwork can have potential to get caught between material.

M.O.T. SIGNAGE

PINCH POINTS ON TYPE 2 FOLDING

### SIGNAGE

Keep hands on the board of the sign grab outside of the metal pinch point.

### FENCE PANELS

#### PINCH POINT

When placing or stacking fence

panels keep your hands out from between the bracing. Use the wire to keep your fingers from getting caught in between.

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE



#### PINCH POINT

Looks simple but what if you put your hand underneath before setting on the stand?

HAND 45 SAFETY

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE



#### KNAACK Box Bite!

Handle is exactly for that.

Conditions of Knaack box? Do cylinders function properly?

Not in good shape but that is all we have?

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE



MATERIAL HANDLING

#### PINCH POINT

Keep your hands out from under the material. Dependent on the situation take your time and only grab as many as you can comfortably to carry.

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE

#### CRUSH POINT

#### Keep hands and fingers on outside of connex door.

KEEP YOUR HANDS IN THE RIGHT PLACE

#### CRUSH POINT

When stripping / installing overhang brackets. Keep hands clear of anchors.
